All students should update career portfolios and continue individual career research.

Juniors: Create a list of your top 10 colleges. Register for May SAT I or II early to avoid late fees. If you are taking an AP course, prepare now for May AP Exams. Find out about possible summer programs on college campuses from your counselor or career information center. When registering for your senior year courses, be sure to select strong college preparatory courses.

Seniors: If you have received a college acceptance letter or an award for a scholarship, please let Ms. Prout and Ms. Walls know as soon as possible. Make sure your Student Aid Report (SAR) reaches the financial aid offices of your potential colleges as soon as possible. Your aid package will be determined by using this report. Some colleges have March application deadlines – don't miss them. Continue searching for scholarship opportunities.

Various representatives from colleges, the armed services, technical schools and apprenticeship programs will be in the Career Center throughout the year. In order to hear these representatives, you must sign up in the Career Center before the presentation. Passes will be issued through homeroom teachers or first period teachers on the morning of a presentation. Please sign up early!
