



Dear Parents:

Your child's fifth grade class is preparing to visit Kamp A-Kom-Plish for their environmental education overnight experience. The camp is located in Nanjemoy on a beautifully wooded 108-acre property that provides students an opportunity to apply the skills and knowledge acquired in the classroom to an outdoor learning environment. The class will be immersed in nature studies as we observe the pond, field and forest habitats. Our studies include Charles County birds, weather, pond ecology, and water quality. This trip promises to be action packed and will provide memories for years to come.

While at Kamp A-Kom-Plish, your child will be involved in "hands-on" and "minds-on" learning to develop a better awareness and understanding of the environment of which they are a part. Your child's class will begin work on a Memory Book before their trip to help them prepare for their experience and will use it while at the camp to record their observations during their field studies. Completion of the Memory Book back in the classroom will provide an opportunity to reflect upon their learning and share their experiences with the class. All of these activities were designed to build upon the skills necessary to succeed on the Maryland State Assessment and meet the objectives of the Charles County Essential Curriculum for 5th graders.

During this overnight trip, students and chaperones will sleep in climate-controlled cabins. Each student will need to bring a bag lunch and drink for the first day. Please see the Memory Book regarding the "trash-free" lunch challenge when packing this meal. A hot dinner will be prepared by a local school's kitchen and delivered in time for the evening meal. The second day's breakfast and lunch will be provided for your child as well. Please make your child's teacher aware of any food allergies or restrictions as soon as possible so you can plan how to handle those needs.

Your child's class will visit Kamp A-Kom-Plish on _____. Students should arrive at school as usual on the day of their trip with their gear. They will then board a bus to travel to Kamp A-Kom-Plish. The students will return to school in time for their regular school dismissal the next day.

WHAT TO BRING TO KAMP A-KOM-PLISH (adjust according to weather)

1. Sleeping bag or two blankets
2. Two pairs of jeans or slacks
3. Heavy shirt
4. Light shirt
5. Warm jacket or sweater
6. Two pair of sneakers or hiking shoes (be prepared for them to get muddy)
7. Heavy socks
8. Light socks
9. One pair of pajamas
10. Underwear (2 pair)
11. Raincoat or poncho
12. Plastic bag for dirty clothes
13. Toothpaste and toothbrush
14. Soap
15. Deodorant
16. Hand towel & washcloth for evening and morning hygiene
17. Comb or brush
18. Hat & Gloves
19. Water bottle ** Very important if weather is warm **
20. Insect Repellent/Sunscreen

OPTIONAL - YOU MAY BRING:

1. Small pillow
2. Camera

DO NOT BRING:

Kamp A-Kom-Plish is a school site. Any items normally banned at school are also banned here. Other items to leave home are: flashlights, matches, CD or MP3 players, candy, extra food, electronic games or equipment, cell phones and money.
